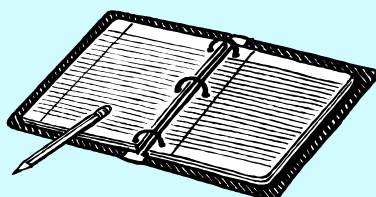

Parish Nurse Resources for Sexual Abuse Survivors

Anne Van Loon, RN, PhD, of the Australian Faith Community Nurses Association, recently completed two books which are available free online for people wanting to do group work with women who are survivors of child sexual abuse (CSA).

She writes, “The books have received a fantastic reception from CSA survivors and the service providers to this group of women. The women's book is called *Reclaiming Myself after Child Sexual Abuse*. It is a guided 'self-help' book which can be used to work one-on-one with a woman survivor, or it can form the basis of group work. The process we used is described in the second book, *Facilitating Transition after Child Sexual Abuse*. Listening, one will hear the sound of a bell. Looking around for the source of the sound, one will see that it comes from the smaller horse in the field. Attached to her halter is a small bell. It lets her blind friend know where she is, so he can follow her.

As one stands and watches these two friends, one sees how she is always checking on him, and that he will listen for her bell and then slowly walk to where he is trusting that she will not lead him astray.

Like the owner of these two horses, God does not throw us away just because we are not perfect or because we have problems or challenges.

He watches over us and even brings others into our lives to help us when we are in need. Sometimes we are the blind horse being guided by God and those whom He places in our lives. Other times we are the guide horse, helping others see God.
